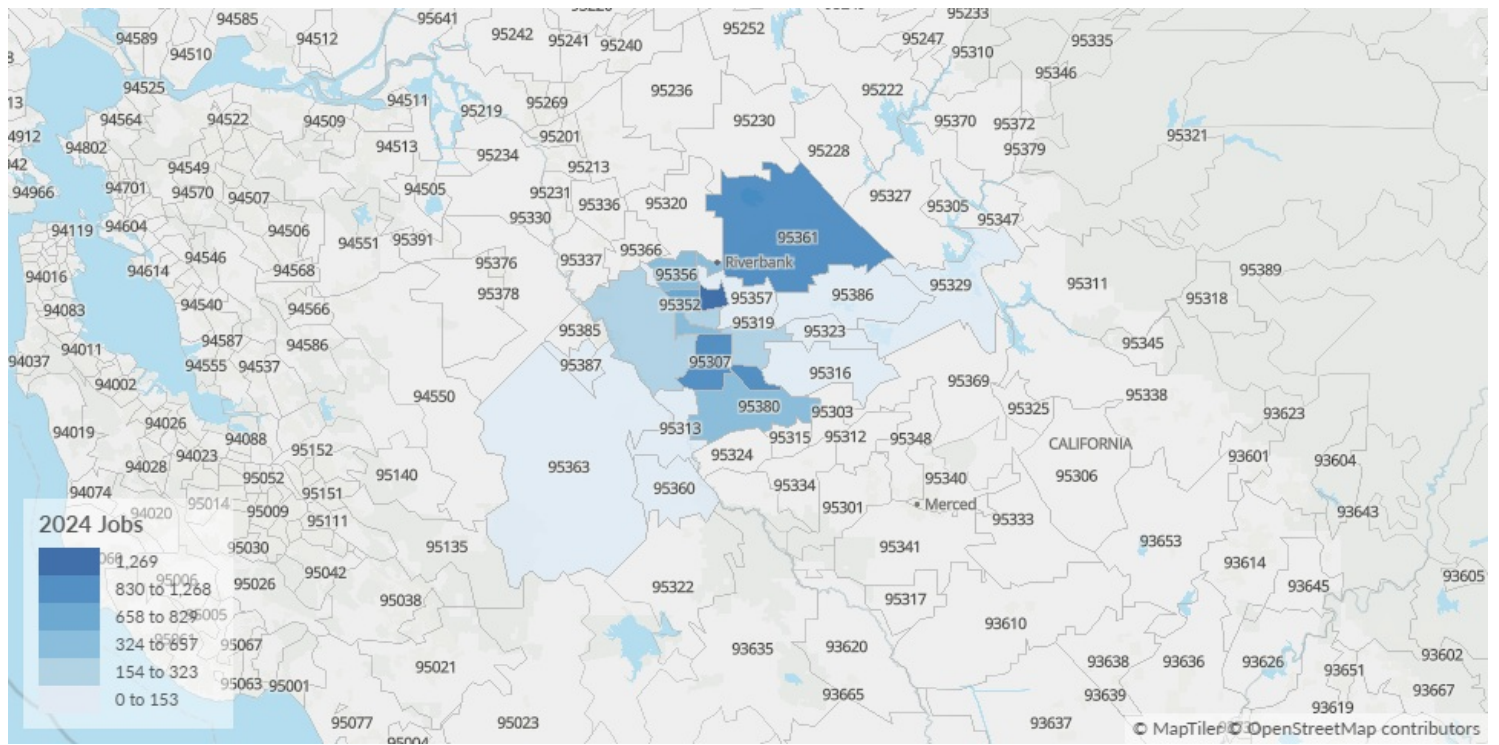

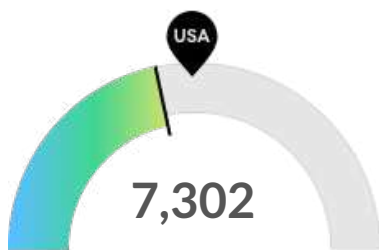

### Light Hiring Competition Over a Thin Supply of Regional Talent



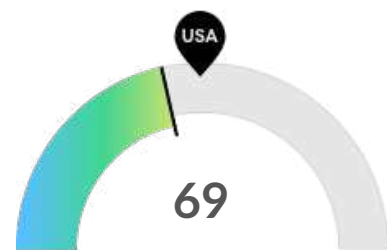
**Supply (Jobs)**

Stanislaus County, CA is not a hotspot for this kind of talent. The national average for an area this size is 8,923\* employees, while there are 7,302 here.



**Earnings Per Job**

Earnings per job are about the same as the national average. Earnings per jobs is the total industry earnings divided by the number of jobs in the industry.



**Demand (Job Postings)**

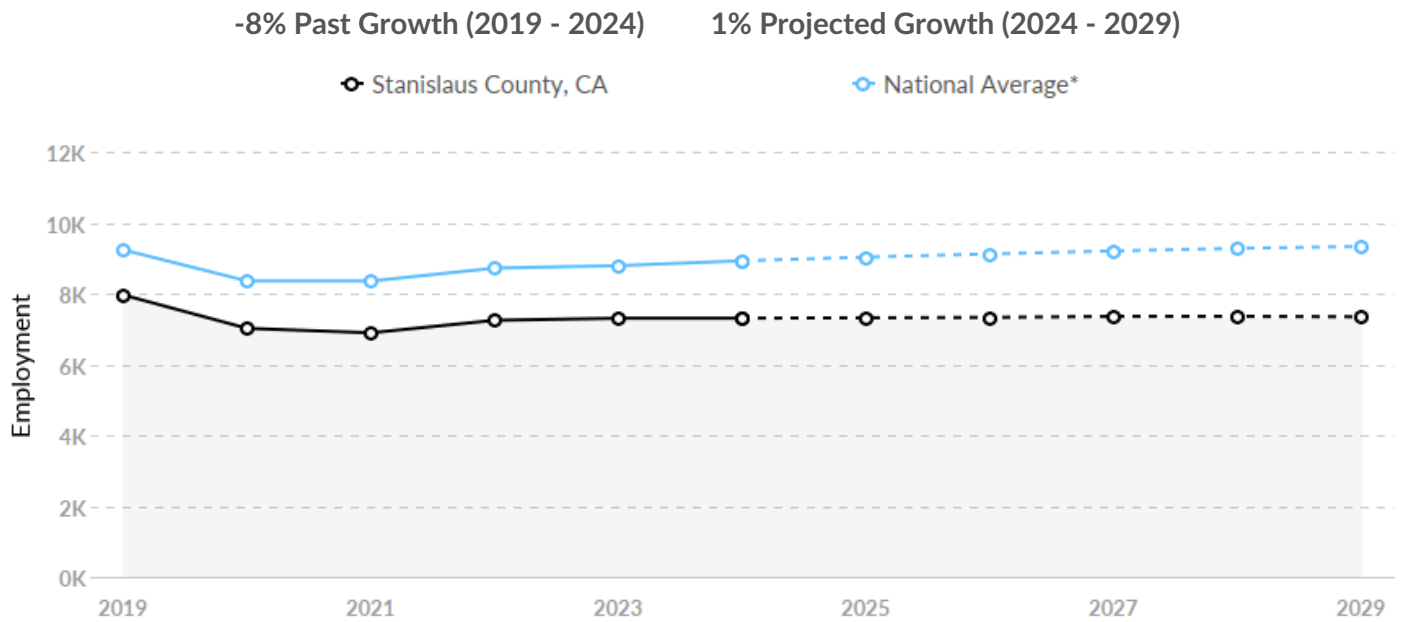
Competition from online job postings is low in Stanislaus County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 85\* job postings/mo, while there are 69 here.

# Supply (Jobs)

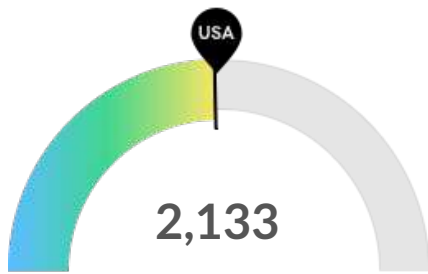
## Supply Is Lower Than the National Average

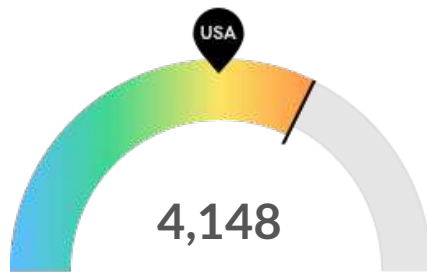

## Retirement Risk Is About Average, While Overall Diversity Is High



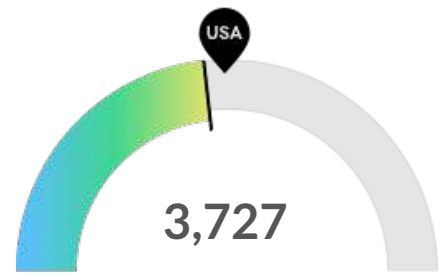
**Retiring Soon**

Racial diversity is high in Stanislaus County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 2,764\* racially diverse employees, while there are 4,148 here.



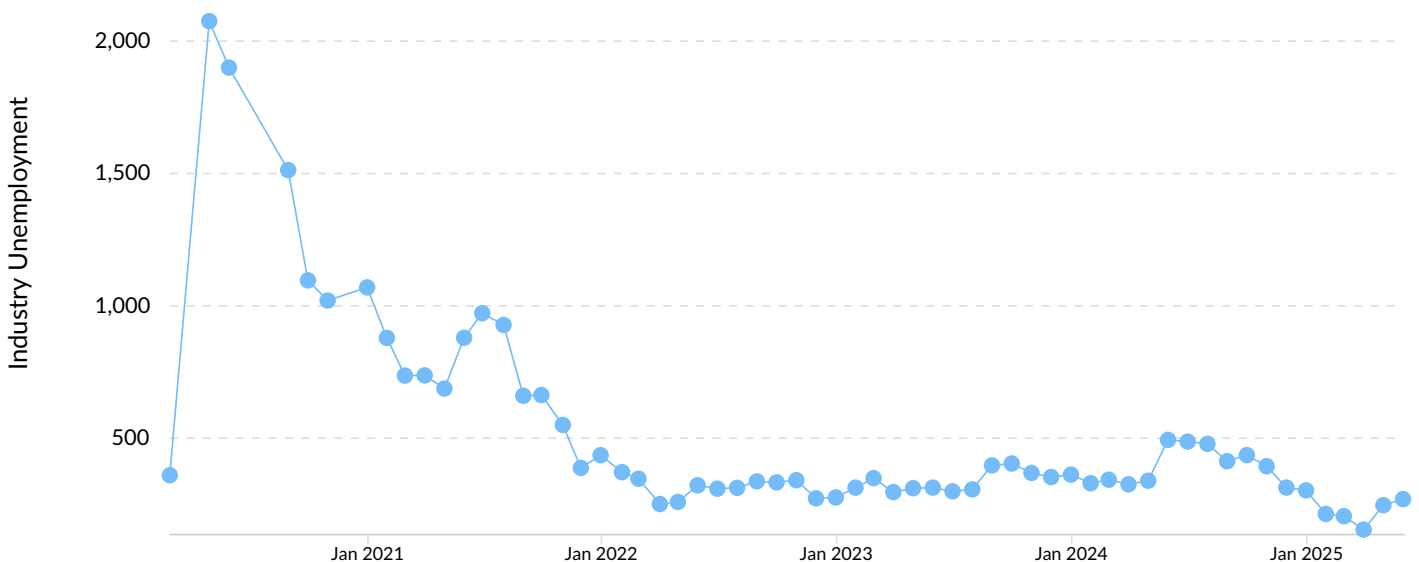
**Gender Diversity**

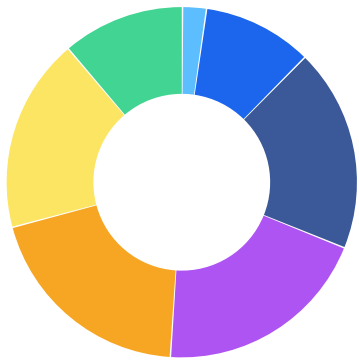
## Unemployment Rate Trends

Unemployment shown at the 2-digit sector level.



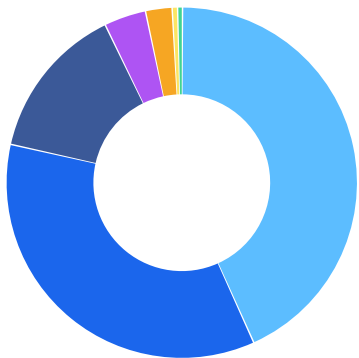

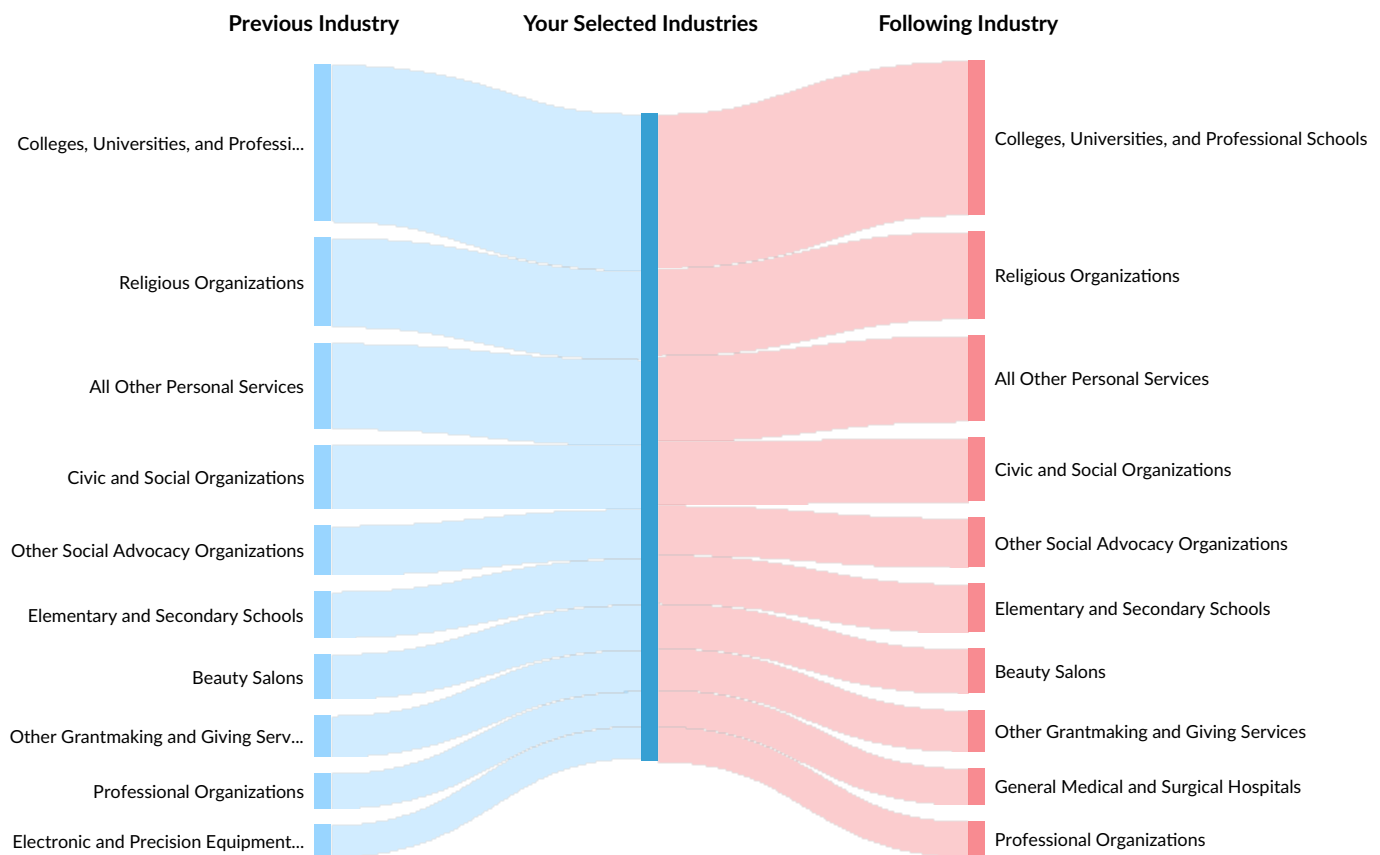
